## The Event

First Ladies' Luncheon serves as United Way of West Tennessee's largest annual fundraising event, drawing large crowds each year to highlight the incredible work of women in our West Tennessee community. As a TableScapes Event, sponsors purchase and decorate a table, gleaning inspiration from nearly any source imaginable. The 10th Annual First Ladies' Luncheon will take place at the Jackson Fairgrounds on April 13, 2023. This year's keynote speaker will be Meg Kinnard, West Tennessee Native and Associated Press National Reporter.

#### The Ambassadors

### Our Mission

Meghan Kinnard Hardee, professionally known as "Meg Kinnard," is a national politics reporter for The Associated Press, covering the US South. A 7th-generation Tennessean, she grew up in a political family, and received her bachelors degree in international politics with a concentration in international security studies from the School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University in Washington, D.C. She has a Master of Arts in Digital Communication from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Though Meg was raised in Memphis, her fondest childhood memories are of her grandparents' Yorkville farm in Gibson County. She is the only grandchild of former Tennessee commissioner of agriculture and 8th-District congressman, U.S. Rep. Ed Jones.



As a high school and college student, she interned for the Tennessee Republican Party, served as a House Page for Democratic U.S. Rep. John Tanner, and interned for the United States House of Representatives Committee for Government Reform. At Georgetown, Meg joined the College Democrats and College Republicans - at the same time. This diverse political exposure would prove helpful when her desire to work for the CIA was altered after she joined the staff of the Georgetown Independent - a decision that changed her career plans.

After an internship with The Washington Post, Meg worked as an assistant editor at National Journal in D.C. A chance conversation at a bar in Columbia, South Carolina, led to an 18-year (and counting) career with The Associated Press. In 2008, she was awarded AP staffer of the year, and in 2022, received an Oliver S. Gramling Award - AP's highest internal honor.

In 2021, Meg was diagnosed with Stage 3C inflammatory breast cancer. Initially misdiagnosed at her local hospital, she sought a second opinion at the M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas, where she was correctly diagnosed.

Today, she travels monthly to Houston for immunotherapy, as part of a clinical trial, to hopefully prevent her cancer from ever returning. She has committed to urging others to advocate for themselves and helping to ensure the opportunity to seek a second opinion at a leading cancer center is available to more people.

Meg now calls South Carolina home, although Tennessee will always hold a large part of her heart. She and her husband, Geoffrey, have three children and have stayed connected to West Tennessee by becoming boosters and friends of UT Martin, the alma mater of her grandparents and great-grandfather, keeping the Ed Jones legacy alive through their support of the special collections of the Paul Meek Library, which houses his congressional papers.
